Our Mission

The mission of New Life Academy of Excellence, Inc. is to partner with parents/guardians of Gwinnett County by offering a school of choice. We achieve our mission by providing an educational environment for academic achievement and individual growth and development. We prepare students to be successful in a global economy through the opportunity for them to learn Mandarin Chinese.

Nondiscrimination Policy

New Life Academy of Excellence enrolls students of any race, color, gender, ethnic origin, or religion who live in Gwinnett County. New Life Academy of Excellence does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, gender, ethnic origin, or religion in hiring practices or the administration of educational or co-curricular programs. In addition, the school is not intended to be an alternative to court or administrative agency ordered or public school district initiated desegregation.

Academic Knowledge and Skills (AKS) Curriculum

Education is vastly improving and with this in mind, we have equipped ourselves to improve.

The teaching staff at New Life Academy of Excellence, Inc. uses the Academic Knowledge and Skills (AKS) Curriculum. The AKS represents the Board of Education's accepted content standards for excellence in academic knowledge and skills for all students. The AKS includes all the state's curriculum objectives. State and local assessments measure student learning of the curriculum.

Attendance Policies and Procedures

School attendance is important because it underscores the significance of learning and the importance of obtaining an education in our society in addition to helping students develop good work habits that will last a lifetime. Good attendance is the backbone to having good grades. A minimum level of attendance is required for attainment of the AKS Curriculum. The responsibility of school attendance is that of both the parent/guardians and the students. The Director of New Life Academy of Excellence, Inc. has designated the minimum level of attendance that is consistent with state standards. **The School day begins promptly at 8:00 a.m. and ends at 3:00 p.m.**

Definitions:

Truant: Any child subject to compulsory attendance during the school calendar year who has more than five days of unexcused absences.

Compulsory Attendance: Attendance in public Schools, private school, or home school program is required for children between their sixth and sixteenth birthdays. Every parent, guardian or other person residing in this state having control or charge of any child between their sixth and sixteenth birthdays shall be responsible for enrolling and sending such child to a public school, private school or home school program. Attendance in a public school, private school or home school program is required regardless of the fact that a child has been suspended or expelled from school by the local board of education. Official Code of Georgia (O. C. G. A) 20-2-6901.1

Tardy: Students are considered Tardy to school or to class if the student arrives at the student drop-off after 8:00AM. Frequent tardiness of even a few minutes clearly interferes with an individual student's performance. By interrupting the class, it also disrupts other students as well. If a child is late five (5) minutes everyday, they would miss a total of twenty-five (25) minutes of lessons per week.

Early Checkout: When a parent, guardian or other person having charge or control of a student authorizes a student to leave the facility before the end of the school day.

Excused absence or tardy: is one in which the parents/guardians, by written notice, presents a reason for non-attendance. This notification must be within two school days of the child's return to school.

The acceptable reasons for an excused absence or tardy includes:

- Illness
- Medical, dental or other appointment, which cannot be scheduled before or after school
- Recognized religious observance
- Family emergency or events such as funeral or birth

It is important to note that a parent simply excusing a child's absence or tardy by writing a letter, which does not relate to the acceptable reasons mentioned above does not make it excused, i.e., Traffic is not an acceptable excuse for tardiness!!!!

Early Checkout/Tardy Policy

A student should not be released within the final thirty minutes of the school day unless the Director or Administration determines it is an emergency or an excused event.

The School will provide written notice to parent after three (3) early checkouts within a thirty (30) day period. Additional tardy or early checkouts will result in a mandatory conference with the Director.

The school will not recognize students for perfect attendance when they are tardy three or more times or three or more excused early checkouts in a month.

Excessive Tardy Penalties

If your child is continually tardy, (exceeding five (5) per month) the penalty will be Saturday detention to be scheduled for the following month. The hours will be 8:00AM-10:00AM at the rate of \$10 per hour/\$20 per session per child. If the child is late or fails to attend detention they will be suspended the following Monday. Five (5) consecutive tardy in one month will result in one (1) unexcused absence,

If the child is late ten (10) days within one month, the penalty is one (1) day suspension. If the number of tardy exceeds ten (10) within one month, social services or the Truancy Division will be contacted. It must be understood that for the benefit of the child's education, he/she may be required to attend a school that is more accessible for your child.

Behavior Plan and Policies

In effort to provide a safe environment for all of our students and staff we have developed the following policies and procedures.

Disruptive Behavior

Extremely disruptive behaviors included using profane language, throwing objects or other behaviors that significantly disrupt the learning of others.

1st Offense- Teaching staff will conference with the student, call a parent/guardian and/or request a time out in another class, and record in the Student Log.

2nd Offense- Teaching staff will conference with the student and refer the student conference with parents/guardians, send student to another class for a time out, or give the student a pending suspension.

3rd Offense-Teaching staff will refer student to an administrator. Administrator will conference with the student, issue a suspension for 1-3 days, and arrange a parent/teacher/administrator conference to an administrator. The administrator will conference with the student, and one or all of the following: reinstate the student.

Aggressive Behavior

Aggressive behaviors include hitting, kicking, or any behavior that may cause bodily harm to another individual. The severity of the aggressive behavior determines the level of student discipline.

1st Level- Teaching staff/administrator will conference with student and call student's home.

2nd Level- Teaching staff will work with the administrator to resolve the infraction. Administrator will conference with the student, place student on in-school time-out, issue a pending suspension and call student's home to set-up meeting with a parent/caregiver and teaching staff. Pending suspension begins once the student has been removed from class.

3rd Level- Teaching staff will work with the administrator. Administrator will conference with the student, suspend the student for 1-3 days by sending home a suspension letter, and then will arrange a parent/teacher/administrator conference to reinstate the student. Suspension begins once the student has been removed from the class.

Following these policies will provide a safe a nurturing place for all of our students.

Suspension and Expulsion Violations

Listed below are examples of serious violations, whether occurring at school or at school related activities, which could result in suspension or expulsion.

1. Violence, force, or threats of violence or force, coercion, intimidation, bullying, or any other similar behavior that may interfere with another's well being, safety, rights, or daily activity
2. Possession of weapons, facsimiles of weapons, or the suggestion or implication that one possesses such items or has access to them
3. Open defiance, disrespect, or disruptive behavior
4. Cheating
5. Stealing
6. Dishonesty
7. Consistent failure to complete homework or class work

8. Destruction or defacement of school property or others' personal property
9. Trespassing or being in an unauthorized part of the school
10. Leaving the school building or campus without permission
11. Verbal or written profanity or obscenity or any inappropriate gestures or actions
12. Repeated violations of the dress code
13. Other behavior deemed to be seriously inappropriate or repetitive

New Life Academy of Excellence has a zero tolerance policy for all behaviors that can result in potential harm or threat of harm or may be interpreted as bullying or intimidation.

If a student is suspended on three (3) or more occasions, specifically, for a serious breach of discipline including: bringing weapons/drugs to school or threatening students and adults with bodily harm they may be expelled from school.

Rights

Students have the right to an orderly, safe, and wholesome school atmosphere that recognizes their unique gifts, abilities, and talents. They have the right to individual recognition and the fair, firm, and consistent application of policies designed to call forth their best personal efforts to succeed.

Responsibilities

Students have the responsibility to act in such a manner as to not infringe on the rights of others or cause disorder which prevents others from learning or taking full advantage of school activities.

Students are expected to show respect for teachers and all other members of the school community. Relationships based upon mutual respect create a harmonious learning environment.

General Expectations

1. Students have the responsibility to help maintain a safe school environment.
2. Students are to walk in the building including to and from lunch, recess, and all other activities.
3. Students are to use reasonably quiet, conversational voices inside the building.
4. Students may not arrive before their school's designated arrival time and must go directly to a classroom or other specified location when they arrive.
5. Students are responsible for taking good care of all textbooks, library books, school materials, and other school property.
6. Students may not write, draw, or put stickers on school property.
7. Students should label all personal items with their name.
8. Students may not use others' belongings without permission.
9. When students leave a line for any reason, they will go to the back of the line. Places are not saved or cuts allowed.
10. Students may not be in a classroom without adult supervision.

11. Students may not bring to school such things as un-caged pets, matches, guns, bullets, firecrackers, squirt guns, knives, or any other dangerous or disruptive items or replicas of dangerous or disruptive items.
12. Students may not bring their own gym equipment to school without permission.
13. Students will be permitted to use the office phone only with a teacher's or office staff permission.
14. Students may not go home for lunch or leave the school grounds during the day.
15. Students may not chew gum at school or eat on the playground.
16. Students are expected to help keep the playground and building litter free.
17. Cell phones, CD players, radios, pagers, tape recorders, toys, electronic games or other electronic devices, inappropriate printed materials, or other potentially disruptive personal belongings may not be brought to school.
18. Skateboards, rollerblades, and bikes may not be brought to school, enter staff rooms, workrooms, administrative areas, or storerooms without permission.
19. Students may not sell items at school or school functions without permission.
20. Visiting friends or relatives may not attend class with students without prior approval of the main office.
21. Students may not possess or use in any manner tobacco or tobacco products, or items purported to be such, at school or school related activities.
22. Students may not sell, use, possess, or distribute drugs or alcohol, or items purported to be such, at school or school related activities.
23. Students who walk to school are expected to conduct themselves in an appropriate manner.

Classroom Responsibilities and Expectations

Each student has the responsibility and will be expected to do his or her part to make the classroom and school an orderly and productive place where all students can learn. A student is doing his or her part when he or she:

1. Follows all classroom rules and routines as established and required by the teacher.
2. Respects the rights and belongings of others and does not infringe on their personal space or interfere with their work or property.
3. Does not talk in a disruptive manner (loudly or without permission) or make noises or movements that disturb others.
4. Does not throw objects, hit, kick, or do anything to endanger another student's safety.
5. Respects the feelings of others by not bullying, teasing, name calling, or making unkind remarks.
6. Assumes responsibility for having all learning materials and fully completed assignments at school each day.
7. Keeps his or her desk and work area organized and clean.
8. Listens carefully during lessons, follows directions, and makes good use of time without disrupting other students or the learning process.
9. Shows respect to all adults and follows directions willingly and promptly.
10. Treats coming to school as a job and a very important responsibility.
11. Comes to school on time and in complete uniform each school day.

Care of Equipment and Books

Use of school equipment, materials, and books will result in normal wear. Students and parents will be held financially responsible for school furniture, equipment (including computers and associated materials) and other school property such as books and desks which are deliberately or carelessly defaced, marred, or damaged. Books, workbooks, furniture, or equipment that are lost, damaged, or destroyed must be paid for and reimbursement received before the end of the school year. The school retains the right to withhold reenrollment, report cards, and school records until all fees and replacement costs have been paid.

Parent/Teacher Conference

All Parent/Teacher conferences held during the year are mandatory for parents/guardians.

Volunteer Requirement

Volunteers who are in the school on a regular basis must obtain and submit a Police Background check. The background check can be done at your local police station and usually requires a small fee. This requirement is for the protection and well-being of all of the students and staff at New Life Academy of Excellence, Inc.

NLAE Clinic

New Life Academy of Excellence, Inc. follows the guidelines provided by the Gwinnett County Public Schools. All clinics in our system are required to follow these guidelines.

The clinic worker or administrative staff member is CPR certified and is not a certified nurse. And therefore cannot make medical judgments concerning the students, staff or any other individuals within the school. We are interested in the welfare of all our students here at NLAE. We cannot and will not receive or administer aspirin or similar non-prescription medication for any student.

PLEASE NOTE: ANY MEDICATION, INCLUDING PRESCRIPTIONS MUST BE SUBMITTED BY AN ADULT TO THE CLINIC OR FRONT DESK WITH A DETAILED NOTE OF ADMINISTRATION. ALL MEDICATIONS MUST BE IN ITS ORIGINAL CHILD-PROOF CONTAINER WHEN SUBMITTED TO THE SCHOOL. PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION PUT IN BAGGIES, ENVELOPES PAPER BAGS, ETC. WILL NOT BE ADMINISTERED. IF THE MEDICATION HAS TO BE GIVEN MORE THAN ONCE A DAY OR ON A DAILY BASIS, IT MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICAL REQUEST FORM, WHICH CAN BE OBTAINED BY THE CLINIC WORKER OR FRONT DESK.

Illness and Injury

If your child becomes ill or is injured while at school, the school must be able to contact you or your designee. You will be asked to complete an Emergency Medical Card each school year. The school will make every effort to reach you or your designee, based on the information you provide, to make sure that your son/daughter receives the proper attention.

Contagious Diseases

Students suffering from contagious diseases will not be permitted to attend school and will be sent home immediately. Students may not return to school until written notification is provided to the school from a licensed physician, who indicates that the student no longer suffers from a contagious condition.

Uniform Policy

New Life Academy of Excellence, Inc. feels it is important for children to develop an understanding of appropriate dress and appearance to suit the occasion. The manner in which students wear their uniforms reflects pride in their school. **To this end, students are required to wear the approved school uniform and be neatly groomed.**

New Life Academy of Excellence, Inc. feels that a safe and disciplined learning environment is the first requirement of a good school. Young people who are safe and secure, who learn basic life values and the essentials of good citizenship, are better students. Many parents, guardians, teachers and school officials have come to see school uniforms as one positive and creative way to reduce discipline problems and increase focused learning. **The responsibility for having correct uniforms items is the responsibility of the parent/guardian. In the event that a child is in violation of the uniform code, a notification will be sent home. NLAE expects the parent to address the uniform violation promptly.** The goal of the uniform policy is consistency. Therefore, all uniform items other than shoes and accessories must be purchased directly from Uniform Depot which has been selected as NLAE's approved uniform source.

- Crew Neck Button Down Cardigan, Burgundy (optional), with logo
- Socks/Tights-Burgundy or White-solid color only, no prints or designs
- Shoes-Black with rubber soles (no open-toe shoes, sneakers, boots or Heelys)
- Windbreaker Jacket, Burgundy, with logo (optional-pre-sold)

Boys:

- Pique Polo Shirt with Knit Collar, White, L/S and S/S, with logo
- V-Neck Button Down Cardigan Sweater, Burgundy, with logo (optional)
- Vest Pullover Sweater, Burgundy, with logo (optional)
- Windbreaker Jacket, Burgundy, with logo (optional-pre-sold)
- Pleated Double-Knee Pant, Khaki, with logo
- Belt-Black
- Socks-Black
- Shoes-Black with rubber soles (no sneakers, boots or Heelys)

Personal Appearance

Parents are responsible for sending students to school each day with correct and appropriate grooming. New Life Academy of Excellence expects and requires all students to meet the highest standards of dress and deportment. This means suitable and appropriate appearance at school and school sponsored functions. Careful attention to health and safety considerations and a personal presentation that reflects modesty, neatness, and cleanliness are a must. Hair must be kept neatly groomed and clean at all times. It may not interfere with vision or the performance of school activities. Hair styles must be moderate and reflect proper decorum.

Violations of the dress code or personal appearance guidelines will be treated as very serious matters by the staff.

Karate Uniform

On the days that students have Karate they **must** wear their karate uniform with “all-white” or black sneakers. Students may remove their karate jacket, for lunch only, if a solid white T-shirt (not an undershirt) or Karate for Kids T-shirt is worn underneath.

Spirit Day Wear

There will be specified dates on our school calendar that the students may wear Spirit Wear T-shirts. These shirts can be worn with black or blue jean pants, shorts or with the boys’ uniform pants.

Compliance

Students who fail to comply with the uniform policy will need to have their parents bring them the appropriate uniform attire before being admitted to class. The local school administration reserves the right to make the final judgment regarding uniforms. The school administrators reserve the right to modify the uniform policy for special occasions such as field day, spirit day, wacky week, etc.

Violations

Three (3) violations of the mandatory uniform attire make your child ineligible for the Citizenship Award and will result in disciplinary action.

1st Violation: Call from teacher

2nd Violation: Call from teacher and a write-up

3rd Violation: Parent/guardian will be required to come in for a conference with the designated school staff member

Cafeteria Rules

NLAE Cafeteria Rules outline mandatory behavior and etiquette of all students during lunch. Teachers are responsible for integrating the Cafeteria Rules. Each student must engage in correct cafeteria etiquette. All NLAE students must recite and know the Cafeteria Rules as follows:

1. Enter the Cafeteria quietly
2. Go to your assigned table
3. First 10 minutes silent lunch
4. Remain seated at all times
5. Be polite and use good table manners

6. Speak quietly to your neighbors at your table
7. Raise your hand for help
8. Cleanup your mess
9. Throw away trash
10. Line up in H.A.L.L. for dismissal

Hall Rules

NLAE Hall Rules are for all hallway use by every student at all times. Each student must engage in the correct hallway etiquette during all classroom departures and arrivals regardless of teacher or administrative staff supervision. All NLAE students must recite the meaning of each Hall Rule as follows:

H Hands at your side

A All eyes forward

L Lips zipped

L Low speed

“Give me Five”

The phrase “Give me five” is a behavioral tool used at NLAE to ask students for silence. The phrase is a physical and visual aid; as each student is asked to “Give me five,” a hand is raised in participation. The student’s participation signifies behavioral self awareness.

“Give me five”, is an opportunity to further pursue character building. All students know that a hand represents the number five. The hand is a visual and physical tool that can denote five character traits that each NLAE student must strive to embody. Each finger on the hand represents one of the five character traits. The phrase “Give me five” can create a constant reminder of the personal behavior standards each NLAE student must attain.

“Give me five”

1. Honesty- Thumb
2. Respect-Index Finger
3. Responsibility-Middle finger
4. Tolerance –Ring Finger
5. Motivation-Pinkie or little finger

NLAE Character Traits

A NLAE student chooses **honesty** first.

A NLAE student shows **respect** for all.

A NLAE student honors every **responsibility**.

A NLAE student extends **tolerance** for all.

A NLAE student is a model of self **motivation**.

Lunch Program

Campus Cuisine, an independent lunch provider, is the approved lunch program for NLAE.

Campus Cuisine's online ordering process provides many flexible options. Choose to order from one (1) to five (5) days per week. You may place orders weekly, monthly, by semester or as little as one school day before on-line. Changes and cancellations can also be made online.

If you do not wish to order your child's lunch through Campus Cuisine **you must pack a lunch for them daily**.

Field Trips

Students may be provided with off-campus educational opportunities to expand their knowledge and broaden their learning experiences. All field trips sponsored by the school will be adequately chaperoned by teachers, administrators, parents, or other adults. Students will not participate in field trips without prior written permission from parents/guardians and the approval of the teacher.

Birthdays and Special Occasions

Your child's birthday is a very special occasions and we enjoy celebrating it with you. However, to provide safety to all of our staff and students, we can only allow **store bought** snacks and treats, **in the original packaging**, to be brought in to celebrate. Please schedule all birthday parties and special occasions with your child's teacher in advance.

Inclement Weather

If school is cancelled for inclement weather, the days will be made up as indicated by the Gwinnett County School calendar. School closings will be announced on GCPS Television and via Metro-Atlanta radio and television stations.

Withdrawal

1. Arrangements for student withdrawals must be made in advance through the school office.
2. Parents must complete a school withdrawal form.
3. All students must complete the withdrawal procedure, which includes submission of overdue school work and return of all school property.
4. All financial obligations to the school must be paid in full.
5. School records will be transferred upon receipt of a parental release of records request, return of all school property, and payment of all financial obligations. School records will be transferred directly to the new school of choice.

Parent Contract

Whereas, I as the undersigned parent(s)/guardian(s) have made a personal decision to enroll my child at the New Life Academy of Excellence, Inc. in order to provide my child with a unique educational opportunity;

Whereas, my desire and decision to enroll my child at the New Life Academy of Excellence, Inc. is based upon my desire to become an active partner in the education of my child; and

Whereas, I recognize that the New Life Academy of Excellence, Inc. is a public charter school of choice not entitlement;

Therefore, as a parent/guardian of a student at New Life Academy of Excellence, Inc. my commitment is to abide by the following rules and regulations:

- To recognize and embrace my role as having primary responsibility for the education of my child.
- To attend all conferences scheduled with any member of the New Life Academy of Excellence, Inc. staff.
- To purchase uniforms including logo for my child from New Life Academy of Excellence, Inc. approved supplier and ensure my child abides by the Dress Code of the New Life Academy of Excellence, Inc.
- To provide nutritious snacks and lunch daily whether packed or preordered through Campus Cuisine.
- To provide transportation to and from school for my child. It is my responsibility to have my child in school on time each day as well as have them remain for the entire school day unless there is a scheduled appointment or family emergency. I understand that occasionally I may be late, however, I will abide by the Early Checkout and Tardy Policy provided to me.
- If I am late picking up my child, I understand that I will be charged for after-school care at \$15.00 for the first minute and \$1 per minute thereafter, per child. I understand that this fee must be paid within two (2) weeks of accrual and that no **payment arrangements will not be accepted for late pick-ups.** After five (5) consecutive late pick-ups the authorities will be contacted for abandonment.
- I will meet my financial obligation to the school (i.e. material fees, NSF fees, unreturned fundraising material, etc.) I understand that I may request the opportunity to make payment arrangements. It is my responsibility to contact the Business Manager to make such arrangements if necessary. I understand that if I have outstanding debt to the school, I will not receive Report Cards or be able to have my child's records transferred to another school.

Therefore, as parent/guardian of a student at NLAE I agree to the following in order to enhance my child's academic growth:

- To read and use information sent home by the school to keep parents/guardians informed of the academic topics to be introduced and studied in the classroom.
- To check my child's homework folder nightly.
- I will read to or make sure that my child reads for a minimum of twenty (20) minutes per day, four (4) days a week.
- To encourage my child to reach his or her academic potential with deep commitment and enthusiasm for learning.
